

United Way of the Capital Region Community Investment Facts

Services provided by United Way of the Capital Region's program partner agencies help residents throughout the Capital Region. Programs and services receiving United Way funding must provide us with information on the individuals served by location, age, gender, race and ethnicity. We do this so we can assure our donors that the critical needs of our community are being met.

From April 2016 to March 2017, United Way of the Capital Region provided financial support to 37 program partner agencies that provided a total of 65 programs. Residents of Dauphin, Cumberland and Perry counties received help in the areas of health, education, financial stability and basic needs.

186,059 residents of Dauphin, Cumberland and Perry counties combined

36,859 residents of Eastern Cumberland County

128,940 residents of Dauphin County

20,260 residents of Perry County

Of those served who identified themselves with specific client characteristics:

2 percent were Asian

16 percent were African American

10 percent were Hispanic

61 percent were Caucasian

1 percent were bi or multi-racial

10 percent were from other ethnic backgrounds

19 percent were men

30 percent were women

51 percent were children

11 percent were ages 0-6 years

19 percent were ages 7-11 years

13 percent were ages 12-18 years

48 percent were ages 19-64 years

9 percent were 65 years of age or older
