Meet Nicole & Tiffany

Nicole and Tiffany of Newport were struggling with health issues that prevented them from employment. They needed help to get on track and didn't know where to turn.

A friend connected them to *Contact* to *Care*, a community pilot project which helps the uninsured navigate the healthcare system, overcome barriers to care and connect with a primary health provider.

Contact to Care expanded to serve Perry County residents in January 2020. The community health workers were delighted to welcome Nicole and Tiffany as their first clients. "They helped take away the complications and burdens," Tiffany says.

Within a few short months, Nicole and Tiffany dramatically changed their lives. They secured a primary health provider and received vision, dental and other services to help them obtain wellness.

Today, Nicole and Tiffany are feeling great. They are both employed and volunteering within their community.

"This has been a lifesaver," Nicole says. "Thank you to everyone who supports this program."
