A Decade of Trust: Free Tax Service Gives Couple Peace of Mind

For more than a decade, Rachel and Ken of Perry County have utilized the Money in Your Pocket Program at Perry County Literacy Council for their tax preparation. The program, led by United Way of the Capital Region, utilizes trained volunteers to prepare taxes for low- to moderate-income working families in the Capital Region.

“The volunteers are great,” Rachel says. “I trust their work.”

Through Money in Your Pocket, clients have their taxes prepared

at no cost and receive peace of mind knowing skilled volunteers have completed and filed their taxes. This service allows clients to focus on what is most important in their lives.

“We will save our refund to use for next year’s heating bills,” Rachel adds. “The refund and the free service is very helpful.”

Money in Your Pocket is a community collaboration of organizations committed to the economic stability of local families. The program aims

to increase use of the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) and the Child Tax Credit (CTC). The EITC is a tax credit offered by the federal government to supplement wages for low-income workers.

Money in Your Pocket receives financial support from Citizen’s Bank, PNC, the Truist Foundation and the U.S. Department of Treasury, Internal Revenue Service.
